6.0 COUNTY CAPTAIN'S REPORT –Trevor Ryan (Coxmoor GC)

2021 saw a slightly delayed return to Midland league matches in June following the disrupted 2020 season due to Covid restrictions.

The Midland league campaign was a mixed affair winning 2 matches and losing 3. This season was a case of nearly but not quite in that that going into the last two matches there was a strong possibility of winning the league but with only 2 home fixtures and 3 away, including the last 2 fixtures away, results didn't play out as hoped and the end result was a 4th place league finish.

The standard of 1st team golf is incredibly high now and Nottinghamshire need to

continue to adapt to maintain the standard needed if we are to succeed in winning the league title – it has been a while. To illustrate, we witnessed multiple birdies and eagles from both teams in the opening match against Warwickshire at Hollinwell and this high standard was a constant in each of the matches played this year. Our Achilles' heel has been the morning foursomes' format in which we failed to take a lead into any of the afternoon singles matches despite strong pairings, however, the singles format has generally been a success.

16 players have represented the County 1st team in 2021 which highlights a degree of depth in the squad. We have benefitted from having access to our US College based players as well as a good mix of experience and youth. Another bonus this year has been the return to county golf from a few players after a few years away. The team spirit throughout and has been excellent and a real pleasure to be involved with. Clubs represented include - Beeston Fields, Chilwell Manor, College Pines, Coxmoor, Hollinwell, Sherwood Forest and Wollaton Park.

There have been several highlights this year but arguably the standout was in the farcical match against S&H at Church Stretton golf club in July.

- Heavy rain had caused delays and ongoing debates over whether the course was playable, ombined with our opponents not wanting to play any singles matches at all, was then brought to a head on being advised that league rules dictate that games cannot start after 4pm despite many hours of daylight left (it was mid-summer!).
- So, a significant match came down to just 3 singles matches getting on the course before the 4pm curfew.
- A win for each team in the first two games meant that we had to win the last game.

Benson was 3 down with 5 to play but then proceeded to play the next 5 holes in level 3's, four of which were birdies to win on the last and secure the match for Nottinghamshire.

- Very impressive and exciting too but we would have much preferred to have had all 10 singles matches play to decide the match.
- The 4pm rule needs reviewing and changing to vary based on hours of daylight available at the time of year and not have a fixed cut off time One to be raised with the Midland league.

As defending Midland region champions Nottinghamshire acquitted themselves well at Birstall golf club

in July, finishing in a very creditable 3rd place as a team. Jordan Boulton and Killian Ryan were the joint leading individual scorers for Nottinghamshire and finished tied 10th. Having now tasted success in this event after nearly 40 years since the last win it would be great for the union to focus efforts on developing a strategy for

winning the Midland qualifier again sooner rather than later, in line with how Northumberland have done in the Northern region qualifier.

Some of our players have achieved individual success in Midland and National events too with wins by:

- Ross Overton Midland Mid- Amateur @ Coventry golf club
- Killian Ryan Kedleston Goose @ Kedleston Park golf club There was also success in the English Amateur championship @ Headingley golf club.
- Jake Benson, Jordan Boulton, Mark Porter, Jack Sallis, and Fred Tindale all qualified from the stroke play to play in the title deciding match play event with Jake and Fred making it throughto the last 32.

Special mention should go to Finn Nelson who has had a great season and won the Midland Youths championship @ Stoke Rochford golf club. We hope Finn will feature in the 1st team when he is back from US college each year.

I would also like to congratulate Malcolm Brown and all who have played for the county 2nd team in 2021 for their Midland league win. A tremendous achievement and great to see more success for Nottinghamshire golf.

The challenge for Nottinghamshire (and other counties) men's county golf continues to be fixture conflicts with World ranking, England and National amateur events attracting the better players and therefore compromising county matches in terms of quality and availability. It is imperative to ensure a continual development of U18 players to be able to move into men's county golf, but it is equally important that the men's squad is developed too if Nottinghamshire golf is to continue to compete atMidland and National levels.

I would like to thank the players, the union and executive, and all involved in Nottinghamshire County golf. It has been an honour to captain the county for a second time and to have contributed to a bit of history making in winning the Midland Qualifier in 2019.

I handover a strong squad of players to the next county captain and wish him and the squad the very best of success in 2022 and 2023.

At that time Wollaton Park Golf Club, being owned by the council, had rules where for membership there was preference to people living in the city of Nottingham and I lived in Woodthorpe, which, being in the county, meant that despite my father being on the committee I had to join the waiting list. Whilst waiting it was suggested that I joined Hollinwell which I did in 1968 for an annual subscription of just £4 despite being at work I was a junior - junior membership went to age 30!

This is one of the reasons that I strongly support junior golf and I commend the hard work of Stan Yeomans and his team who have done so much over such a long time. For many years our juniors have competed with much larger counties and it takes a lot of hard work to do that. The juniors of today are not only the county players of tomorrow but also the members and administrators of tomorrow.

Ladies and gentlemen thank you very much indeed I shall do my best to uphold the traditions of our county.
