04 Correspondence, Hon. County Secretary, Colin Bee

The Secretary explained to the Executive he had received an email from Mark Romasuik, England Golf detailing what suspension procedures would be put in place for clubs that fail to become accredited in relation to the Safe Golf.

05 NUGC Accounts 2021 & Budget 2022, Hon. Treasurer Gordon Bruce.

Accounts for 2021

The Hon. County Treasurer, Gordon Bruce, explained the accounts were very straight forward and were in line with the budget except that:

- 1) There was a substantial increase in subscription income due to increased membership numbers.
- 2) The coaching expenditure was considerably less than budget due to Covid restrictions.

There is a surplus of £36,221.

There were no questions from the floor.

The Accounts were unanimously approved and agreed and the County President and County Treasurer signed them as a true record.

Budget for 2022

Gordon Bruce introduced the proposed budget for 2022 highlighting the following points:

- Subscriptions, when the calculation of surplus subscriptions was done in August the estimate was £19,545. The actual figure was considerably more at £36,221
- The subscription for 2022 was agreed at £9.40

- An increase of the mileage allowance from 40p –45p in all sections has been agreed.
- Honorariums have been subject to an inflationary increase at 31st
 October 2021 3.8%
- Facility fees based at new rates.
- Nippers Agreed no charge for entry fees
- Coaching Expenditure based on the coaching budgets.
- Special reserve- To hold a reserve of £60,000.
- Surplus next year will be £15,986.

Response

lan Radmore, Beeston Fields GC said that whilst the county has decided to fund the nippers, could they also look at reducing fees in other county junior events.

Response

Points made:

- The Council have decided to have a Junior OOM this year in which they will receive a salver to keep and be presented with a trophy.
- Junior Organisers need to encourage them to enter these events.
- If membership figures keep increasing, we can look at a reduction to entry fee in Junior events.

The Budgets were unanimously accepted by the meeting.

Affiliation fee 2023

The Treasurer explained to the Executive that to maintain the level of reserves, which at a high level, he intends to keep the affiliation fee for 2023 the same at $\mathfrak{L}9.40$

A vote was taken and it was unanimously agreed.

06 Annual Dinner Report, Andrew Tuttey

The Secretary confirmed that, following the cancellation of this year's event, there was no cancellation fee from the hotel, also no cancellation fee from the speaker who has been booked in advance for 2023.

Rooms have been booked for those who want to stay, and the afternoon tea has also been booked.

We are all hoping to get back to some normality in 2023.

ENGLAND GOLF REPORT

The Secretary confirmed all clubs are sent reports from England Golf on a regular basis. He suggested if voting members are interested in receiving these reports to let us know and you can be added to the distribution list.

MIDLAND GOLF REPORT

The Secretary said there was no report from Paul Keeling, Stanton on the Wolds GC. But he himself would be attending a MGU meeting next week in which two board members from England golf will be attendance.

08 <u>Discussion of new Open Competition Colin Bee</u>

The County Secretary informed the Executive there had been no further work done towards this but asked the Executive if they had any views. He confirmed he will present more details at the next Executive meeting in November.

09 Constitution Update and discussion Peter Trotter

Peter Trotter, Vice President, The Nottinghamshire GC, confirmed that the entire Executive had been sent the changes to the Constitution prior to the meeting.

He felt the current constitution didn't reflect what we did as a Union.

Most changes were concerning CONGU to WHS and he had updated officers for re- elect/ elect.

With one exception, all of the proposed changes reflect the actual AGM procedure and would result in the AGM procedure following the Constitution requirement.

Housekeeping changes were proposed to reflect the move from CONGU to WHS handicapping.

One substantive change to clause 7.3 would allow the Council to propose from time to time for retiring Vice-Presidents to receive the title of Lifetime Vice-President.

All changes require approval at the AGM in March.
